

EUR ING Registration Applicant Guidance Notes

This document provides a clear guide for engineers applying for the European Engineer (EUR ING) registration. It outlines the requirements, evidence and assessment process to ensure a complete and accurate application.

Eligibility Requirements

Applicants must hold current registration with the Engineering Council as a Chartered Engineer (CEng) or Incorporated Engineer (IEng) and be a member of a licensed Professional Engineering Institution.

Before You Start

Ensure you have the following ready before beginning your application:

- Engineering Council registration certificate (CEng or IEng)
- Degree certificates and transcripts
- Letters from each of your most recent employers (covering your last 3 roles) confirming your job title, dates of employment and responsibilities. Letter must be signed on official headed paper.
- Details of professional competencies and responsibilities.

The Application Process

The European Engineer (EUR ING) register is operated by ENGINEERS EUROPE. The title is awarded by ENGINEERS EUROPE, following scrutiny of applications by its European Monitoring Committee.

Applications for European Engineer registration are submitted directly by candidates via the application tool on [ENGINEERS EUROPE website](#), where it is checked by the Engineering Council and then submitted to the European Monitoring Committee (EMC).

Personal Information

Email address - use a personal email address to ensure continued access.

Member of ENGINEERS EUROPE National Committee (country) - Choose where you are registered as an engineer (this may not be the same as your country of work).

Professional Title – Chartered Engineer (CEng) or Incorporated Engineer (IEng)

Add New Studies

Enter all higher education qualifications.

HEI = Higher Education Institution = University

FCD = First Cycle Degree = Bachelor – usually 3 or 4 years

SCD = Second Cycle Degree = Master – usually 1 or 2 years

SCD Integrated = Integrated Master (MEng) – usually 4 years

To check if your degree is listed on the EEED Database, click the link to EEED database on the application form and search and select your university first, then do the same for your Programme. Check the ‘actual’ and ‘historical’ tabs in the EEED database to identify the programme from which you graduated.

If your degree is not listed in the EEED database, provide full details manually and upload supporting documents.

Add New Registration

Provide details of your Engineering Council registration and upload your certificate. Please note this must be your Engineering Council certificate not the one you received from the Institution you are a member of (i.e. ICE, IET, IMechE etc.).

Career Learning Assessment:

This section is only mandatory for applicants without a Bachelor degree. However, you may upload information in this section if you feel that would add to your application.

This section is for you to provide brief details of how you can demonstrate that you have acquired professional engineering competencies in a number of areas. You may not be able to demonstrate work experience in every area therefore you must demonstrate sufficient experience in the majority of the competences in each of the experience criteria. Your response to each section should not exceed 250 words and should demonstrate how you have applied your knowledge, skills and professional attitude in your engineering work since graduation.

Professional Engineering Experience

Please include a chronology of your professional engineering job titles/brief job description with dates. A letter from your employer must be attached for at least the most recent 3 roles listed. The letters must be signed by your employers and confirm the position you held and the period to/from. If you are self-employed or a consulting engineer, the letters should be from recent clients. Do not submit a CV, as these will not be considered.

Continuing Professional Development (CPD)

This section is only mandatory for EUR ING renewals (i.e. 5 years from the date of the initial application). However, you may upload information in this section if you feel that it would add to your application.

Certification by Candidate

You should check the relevant boxes and ensure that all provided information is correct before submitting the application.

Payment of Application Fee:

Once your application has been checked for completeness by the Engineering Council and is ready for submission to the European Monitoring Committee (EMC), you will be contacted with instructions on how to pay the application fee. Please note that your application will not be submitted unless the payment has been made.

Outcome and Recognition

Once successful, you may use the EUR ING title. This is recognized across Europe and supports professional mobility.

Renewal

EUR ING Registration must be renewed every 5 years with evidence of continued professional development (CPD).
